how this works

- 1 | Go to the midterm presentations website. [click here](#)
- 2 | Click on the name of the student that you want to evaluate.
- 3 | Read the student's explanation of their objectives for each project (these were taken from the final written project explanations submitted with the project schedules).
- 4 | View / Download / Read **all** of the student's presentation.
- 5 | Fill-out the page of this writable PDF evaluation form for the student. Don't forget to give each student a unique ranking from 1 - 10 (1 is best). Save the PDF often.
- 6 | Go on to the next student and repeat until complete.
- 7 | Upload completed PDF to class server. (Before you upload, close and open the PDF to make sure that all your comments and evaluations have been correctly saved.)

important!

- 1 Be thoughtful and honest in your evaluations. Your goal is not to make people feel good, but to give each student feedback that will help them improve in their work. Be kind, but tell them the truth.
- 2 Look at all of the presentations before you start the evaluations – this will give you a baseline from which to work. Evaluate the best projects first.
- 3 You're probably wondering, do you evaluate your own work? Yes!
